



HOPE Ec Foundation is a missionary project that was born in February 2021,

in the midst of a pandemic when everything was closed: Churches, schools, colleges, public entities, etc.



Our foundation is legally constituted in Ecuador through the



MIES (Ministry of Economic and Social Inclusion), made up of the three members of our family.

We wish as a family, has always been to work for God and for the benefit

of people, so that they know about that wonderful God who wants to save us, described by Jesus in a



didactic way in Matthew 25:33-46 "For when I was hungry, you gave me to eat; when I was thirsty, they gave me drink; when I had to leave my country, you welcomed me into your home; when I had no clothes, you gave them to me; when I was sick, they



visited me; when I was in jail, you went to see me."

We live in the coastal city of Manta-Ecuador God allows us to minister to these little ones. We work on two missionary projects, both structured in depressed, vulnerable and deprived areas.

THE FIRST PROJECT: LA REVANCHA-MANTA, where we care for 140 children, ranging from 4 to 15 years old, where we also care for their parents through the SCHOOL FOR COMMITTED PARENTS with seminars on home and family. We do this at night on Thursdays, twice a month at the public school in the sector.









Regarding the children, they receive classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays in two schedules, In the MORNING for those who go to their school in the

afternoon and in the AFTERNOON for those who go to their school in the morning. In each class we begin praising God with songs, pray and give them Bible Studies; As a result, 20 children have

been baptized. Then we give them



reinforcement classes in language, writing, reading thinking



development and English. We work with printed sheets where we follow an order by topic. Each child has their own numbered



pencil case with colored pencils, an eraser, a pencil sharpener and a pencil; he also has his own plastic folder to file his work. **Everything that children receive is totally free.** 

On **Saturday mornings** we meet for our third class of the week, which is biblical only.

This place where we meet in La Revancha is a bamboo house; They have

lent it to us until they sell it. Due to the need for more space because the children are increasing in number, we found ourselves in need of enlarging the place three times; but there is no more space. This reflects our urgent need, and it is to be able to



buy a piece of land and build a local that is our own, to care for our children.

THE SECOND PROJECT: ELOY ALFARO-JARAMIJÓ. It is a fishing city where we also serve lowincome children and in a vulnerable sector, it is considered that the child population of Jaramijó the has highest

malnutrition rate nationwide. Here we give

classes in a place that is not our own either. On Monday afternoons for the children who go to school in the morning and on Wednesday mornings



for those who go in the afternoon, we follow the same program as in La Revancha, with the same range of ages and **Saturday afternoons** is only biblical. Here we serve 78 children and their

families.

Parents are also assisted through the SCHOOL FOR COMMITTED PARENTS twice a month.



For both projects we need to be able to buy our own land and build something simple but comfortable for children, as well as more desks, pencil cases, school supplies, printable sheets, a printer, etc. Another of our projects is to support them with food, through family baskets.

It is important to note that both projects are located in vulnerable sectors with people who live in drugs and other vices. It is for this reason that we transport children from their homes to and from their homes; mothers have expressed their pleasure and tranquility, especially for their girls. We spent more than a year transporting them in our car, a 1998 Nissan Sentra, where



we made up to 7 trips in both directions. Then God allowed us to donate a small van, where we make 4 and 5 round trips. Actually, with the number of children we

have now, what we need

is a **BUSETA** (average capacity of 25 people per trip) and to be able to transport the 140 children from La Revancha and the 78 from Jaramijó, in the shortest possible time. We expect a positive response from God.
